The 2007 Tinto is a blend of 60% Syrah and 40% Tempranillo aged briefly in seasoned French oak. Purple-colored, the nose offers fragrant black cherry and blueberry aromas leading to a supple, savory wine with excellent balance and length. Drink it over the next 1-2 years.

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2007 Las Colinas del Ebro Rosado

The 2007 Rosado is composed of 60% Syrah and 40% Garnacha. Medium pink-colored, it delivers aromas of cherry and rhubarb. On the palate it is crisp and dry with an elegant personality. It should prove to be a versatile brunch and picnic wine.

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2007 Celler Batea Colinas del Ebro Garnacha Blanca

The 2007 Garnacha Blanca is sourced from 100 year old vines. Medium straw-colored, the nose exhibits aromas of melon, mineral, and spring flowers. Crisp and refreshing on the palate, this bargain-priced effort will pair well with raw bar over the next 12-18 months.

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
